Course title :	Quality Assurance and Quality Control Inspector Course
Aim of the course :	<p>The aim of this course is to give executives working within an African Military unit, a Mine Action Centre or a Humanitarian Demining Organisation, the knowledge to manage all the aspects of the quality assurance process.</p> <p>The quality assurance – quality control inspector is in charge of technical standards development and application from the beginning to the end of the demining operations including planning, training of operators and all the phases leading to the elimination of the threat.</p> <p>Finally, he is in charge of quality control, i.e. the last step between the end of a demining operation and returning of the cleared ground to the local authority.</p>
